Sculptor and medical artist Eleanor Crook will use the technique of wax modelling to teach participants to anatomically sculpt a nose upon a pre-cast face before cutting part away to represent tumour excision, disease and trauma defects.

Participants will be instructed how to create a flap and use stitching to reconstruct the area before using colour to create a lifelike moulage head that can be taken away to keep at no extra cost.

Ticket price includes all materials and the day will start with a slide lecture on plastic surgery and nasal anatomy.

No previous experience necessary.
